

26th Sunday Ordinary Time 1st October 2023




This Sunday's Gospel is the parable of the two sons wherein a father asks both of his sons to work in the vineyard for him. The first one refuses but eventually changes his mind and the second one agrees to work and then doesn't. Jesus asks with whom God would be most pleased.

The answer seems straightforward at first glance. The first son did the father's will. However, with a second glance, we see that both sons brought dishonour to the father, the first by his words, the second by his deeds. Neither son was in the right. One had the words, and the other had the deeds. I'm reminded of St Matthew's conclusion to the Sermon on the Mount that merely saying the right words does not ensure entry into the kingdom of heaven. Active obedience to Jesus' teachings must be present.

In today's busy and unusual world, it is quite easy to say one thing and then do another whether it's because we forget to write things on the calendar, get side-tracked or merely overwhelmed but it's important that we think about what we say to God.

To live a life of hearing and doing the will of God is to respect and adhere to Jesus' authority as teacher and Lord. To live a life in which one gives lip service but not life service to his teachings is to disrespect the authority of Jesus. Our relationship with God is very much a do as I say AND do as I do situation.
