

## **Sport news:**

Children from Year 1 through to Year 6 have been participating in a range of sporting activities against other primary schools over the past few weeks.

The U11 girls' football team have been playing league matches at Test Park. Improving with each game, they won one, drew five and lost two of these matches to finish mid-table.

The U11 boys' team drew one and lost two (both 1-0) of their league games and have two more rounds of matches to play before the end of their Autumn season. Clearly inspired by a pre-match pep talk from Saints star Sam Edozie, who was visiting the school to talk to the Year 4 children, they saved their best performance of the season for the County Cup, racing into a three goal lead against Wellstead Primary School before thunder, lightning and torrential rain stopped play. Resuming from that scoreline last week, they conceded two early goals but held on heroically to win 3-2 and proceed through to the next round.

Two more rounds of cross country at Southampton Sports Centre have taken place. Well done to all the runners proudly representing the school and special mention to George (7th), Lochlann (10th), Adriano (13th), Eddie (14th) and Roman (18th) in the boys' race for week 2. Well run to Keira (4th), Eleanor (5th), Aoife (7th) Nadia (12th) and Aurora (17th) in the girls' race for week 2. Week 3 saw more great running from everyone, with George (4th), Lochlann (9th), Eddie (11th), Aleks (15th) and Adriano (17th) our highest finishers. For the girls that week, Eleanor finished 5th, Aoife was 8th and Myah finished 14th.

Approximately twenty-five runners attended Stroud School last Saturday where the children ran a longer race against primary school children from around the county and, once again, ran very well. Special mention to:

Twelve Year 1 and 2 children took part in an indoor athletics festival where they all ran, jumped and threw to the best of their ability.

Twelve children from Year 3 and 4 represented the school in another indoor athletics event where they finished third - an amazing performance! Well done to Daniel, Kavin, Milan, Lochlann, Jakub, Quinn, Ala, Amelia, Inga, Kamila, Aoife and Myah!

Two teams of four players represented the school at the U11 table tennis tournament at Cantell College last week. Our B team just missed out on the quarter finals after finishing third in their group. But well done to Aoife, Alice, Niall and Romeo who reached the final where they lost to a strong team from Highfield C of E School. Both teams will now go on to represent Southampton in the County Finals in December.

Congratulations to Jacob (4JH) and Arlene (3MR) who represented LMC at a National Taekwondo competition in Sheffield a few weeks ago. Jacob reached the quarter finals in his category, whilst Arlene won a silver medal in her category. Well done to both children!

'My family watched and that really helped. I was pleased to get to the quarter finals', said Jacob.

'My family were also there and I was very proud to win the silver medal', added Arlene.

Congratulations to Alex (4JH) who has recently obtained his next karate grading, moving up to blue stripe. ## **Online Safety:**

#### What is artificial intelligence (AI)?

"Artificial Intelligence is talked about a lot but can mean a wide variety of things," says tech expert, Andy Robertson. Al can refer to Artificial General Intelligence — learning to do tasks that humans can do. But most people use Al to mean tools that *seem* intelligent. That is, Al that can create text that sounds human based on information it has drawn from. Tools like ChatGPT and Google Bard work in this way. "But I haven't found it very good at producing human-like thinking," says Robertson.

CEO of Slate Digital, Ilona Brannen, considers AI a "useful tool" to use with children at home or school. "It has the potential to help children build and learn and develop new skills that are fit for the future. And it doesn't have to be scary or overwhelming."

#### How might AI benefit children?

Ademolawa Ibrahim Ajibade explores how AI can benefit children:

Generative AI systems and chatbots are remarkable tools that can:

- Enhance learning experiences such as assisted-learning across diverse topics, including science, tech, poetry, music and arts
- Provide instant answers to burning questions
- · Engage children in fun conversations
- Improve critical thinking skills.

More than just a fancy chatbot, AI opens up a new world of possibilities for kids' learning, creativity and problem-solving.

#### What risks might AI pose?

A common concern with AI is that children will rely too much on it. "It's important to teach your children or students that this is a tool," says Ilona Brannen, "and it's only going to be as good as what you use it for. But the real special magic comes from their own creations and their own unique sense of style. If you compare, for example, Roald Dahl to Charles Dickens, [you'll find] very different writing styles unique to that particular author. Help your children explore what makes their style unique to help them develop their own approach and perspective on things."

"Al technology is capable of simulating the voice of a person, as well as creating images from ideas," says Andy Robertson. "This means it's important for children to (more than ever) not trust everything they read online. Or, perhaps more importantly, every message they get on social media."


