



Christmas is important because it reminds us that:

- Jesus, the Son of God, came to Earth for all people (symbolised through the visits of the Magi and the shepherds, who represent the universal love of God).
- Mary and Joseph both had a strong faith in God, despite the difficulties they faced.

Our main themes in the Christmas topic are different for each year group. We will learn:

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{FS}}$ - Jesus is special and was born in poor circumstances in Bethlehem.

Y1 - People recognised how special the Birth of Jesus was and that we give thanks and praise for his Birth.

Y2 - The journeys of the Christmas story tell us about Jesus and help us understand how we should care for others.

 ${\bf Y3}$ - Jesus was born in poor circumstances. He came to call the poor, the disposed and the marginalised.

Y4 - Angels were messengers of the Good News. We are called to be messengers of that Good News today.

Y5 - As followers of Christ, we are called to give witness to the poor at Christmas.

Y6 - Jesus is the Son of God, God becoming human. Belief in the Incarnation is central to our faith.



We will be exploring the meanings behind Christmas through both our RE lessons and our daily collective worships.
