Rationale for DT: At Springhill, our DT projects are linked to another part of the curriculum. This ensures children have a wider knowledge about the subject area whilst also helping children to make links across the curriculum which research shows helps children to better commit new learning to their long-term memories.

At Springhill, DT is taught according to the national curriculum guidance with topic themed projects.

We teach it this way because: it helps children to remember more as well as increasing enjoyment.

It matches the national curriculum as it covers all areas of the national curriculum. We use the model of revise, design, make and evaluate across all the DT projects. We also cover cooking and nutrition in all year groups.

We go beyond the curriculum here: Our children have an added element of revise before the national curriculum 'design, make and evaluate' to ensure children remember prior learning and pre-skills required for their upcoming unit of work. Pupils are given plenty of opportunities across the DT subject area to secure the core skills from the national curriculum which they achieve very well at Springhill.
