Dear Parents and Carers,

This half term is flying by – one more week and then half term will be upon us.

School Lunches:

Due to feedback in the parents' survey about school portion sizes and the food, I thought I'd do a write up about them to help settle any parent concerns. The leadership team (Mrs Ashworth, Mrs Hall, Mrs Lacey, Mrs Keogh-Foy, Miss Calver and Mrs Reeves) are in the hall at lunchtime every day to help the children. The portion sizes are very good and we have no concerns about these. The lunches provide a third of children's recommended calorie intake for a day. Portion sizes increase when children reach year 3 and in year 5 and 6, they have access to a salad bar too each lunch time. Children tend to have finished their lunch within 15 minutes and they then go out to play (staff check in on how much they have eaten – although we don't make them eat everything). For children who need longer to eat, they remain in the hall until they have finished. Fruit is on offer every day for children to eat after their lunch or they can choose the pudding of the day. We have a huge number of children who love the fruit and tend to choose it every day over the pudding. There is some more information about school lunches in the newsletter.

Friday 13th February:

As Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday are during half term, we will be celebrating these in school on Friday 13th February. We will have Palm Burning Liturgies (in school houses) and we will have pancake races. All eat pancakes at lunch (dietary requirements will be catered for) as well as having an Ash Service in the afternoon. The children always love these celebrations and we will all be ready for Lent.

Ofsted:

Ofsted have changed their inspections and we have attached a letter to the newsletter email to explain the changes to parents. Please do take time to read this.

Discos:

A huge thank you to our DJ, Alex Carvalho Da Silva, who played music all evening for all 3 discos. As usual, the children absolutely loved the school discos. A huge thanks to all of our staff who stayed to help out on their Friday evening. And thank you parents for supporting the disco and for all the lovely comments at collection – we all had a great time.

Lunch Menu:

Our school lunches are:

- Accredited with School Plates Silver award by [ProVeg_UK](#) for our continued work to ensure children eat a balanced diet that contains plant-based ingredients.
- Our Planet Friendly Wednesdays help children to expand their tastes, try more plant-based or vegetarian dishes that consequently help their health and the planet.
- 75% of the meals on the school lunch menu are made from scratch.
- Many of our dishes have hidden vegetables to help towards a child's five a day.
- All the eggs used on the menu are British and Free-Range.
- All our sourced ingredients are fully traceable and are nut free.
- All the meat served on the menu is ethically and sustainably sourced and carries the Red Tractor certification.
- Seasonal vegetables are served with all the menu choices every day.
- A selection of salads and handmade bread is available to all pupils every day in addition to their chosen dish from the menu.
- All our school lunch portions are based on the Government's School Food Plan. These differ from KS1 to KS2.
- On average, over the week, school lunches provide a third of a child's recommended calories every day.
- Why Fishy Fridays are so important - **City Catering - Food For Good** only serves Omega 3 rich fillet fish fingers and bubble salmon as the body naturally doesn't produce Omega 3, and amongst other things, it's good brain health.
- Wholemeal pasta is served to help with children's fibre intake.
- Only Tilda's blend of brown and white rice is served on the menu as it retains more fibre, vitamins, and minerals. It also helps to regulate blood sugar levels.
- '[Food for Life](#) served here' - bronze accredited menus.
- All children in Year R and KS1 are entitled to a free lunch, no matter the family circumstances under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meal Programme (UIFSM)
- Our caterer provides just under 300 special diet menus for children with allergies, intolerances, and SEN across their schools. Of these, a third are bespoke and 20 of these are here at Springhill Catholic Primary School.
- It's proven that children that eat together with their friends are more willing to try new foods at school than at home – Less picky with their peers
