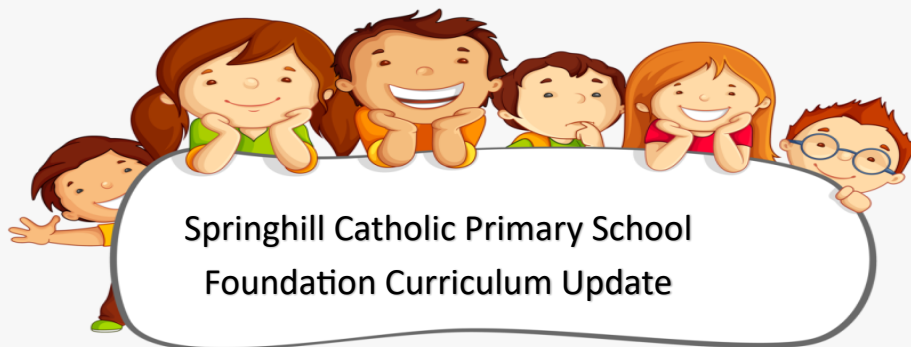

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well done to the children for working so hard last half term. Here is what we have to look forward to this term:

Our topic focuses on 'Growth' and exploring animals and plants and how we can take care of them. We will also be looking at 'Chinese New Year.'

In RE, the children will be learning about the church calendar and that we are in the time of Lent. We will be learning about how we can grow closer to God through following Jesus' example. We will listen to the story of Jesus' life during Holy Week.

In PSHE, we will be focusing on 'Healthy Me' and discussing how exercise, healthy eating and sleep and limited screen time are important for keeping us healthy.

In phonics, the children will continue to practise recognising single sounds and digraphs and blending them together to make words. We will be working on using our phonics books and reading books in class during the lesson. During handwriting, we will revise the letters that have been taught and continue to write some simple sentences and stories.

In maths, we will be revising number bonds to 5, length and height. We will be exploring the composition of numbers to ten and will begin to recall the names of some 3D shapes.

In understanding the world, we will learn about baby animals, life cycles and insects. This will link nicely to our farm visit. The story of the 'Little Red Hen' will remind us of all the animals that live on the farm.

In expressive arts and design, we will be using the story of the Little Red Hen to practise role play and story telling. In music, we will be exploring tuned percussion instruments and working on identifying violins, drums, and trombones.
