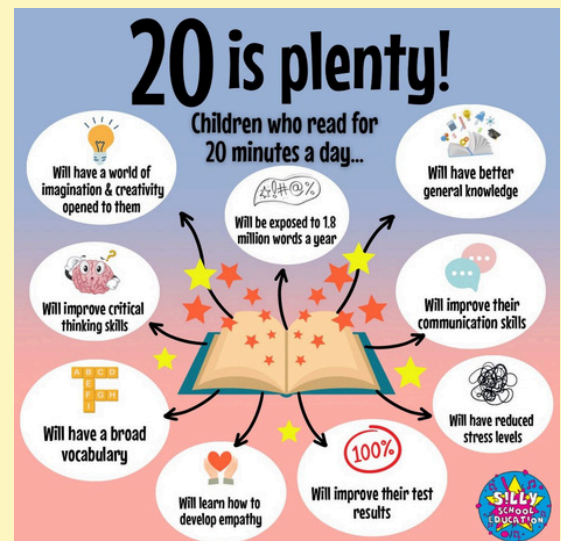

Celebrating Diversity Day – Friday 19th June

We are excited to announce that on Friday 19th June we will be holding a whole-school Diversity Day as part of our English as an Additional Language (EAL) provision. This special day will celebrate the many languages, cultures, traditions and experiences that make our school community so rich and vibrant.

Children are invited to come to school dressed in their national colours, traditional or folk costumes or the colours of their favourite football team. Throughout the day, there will be many opportunities to learn about and celebrate the diverse backgrounds represented within our school.

Those who wish to do so will be able to give a short presentation to their class about a country that is important to them and their family. Children are welcome to bring photographs, albums, artefacts or other items that help them to share their culture and heritage with their classmates.

The day will also include special assemblies celebrating the diversity of our school community. We are delighted that children from our Polish and Spanish after-school clubs will be sharing performances, showcasing their language skills and cultural traditions.

In addition, pupils will take part in a range of creative workshops. Depending on their year group, children will either learn a World Cup-themed dance inspired by one of the participating nations or experience an African drumming workshop. These activities will provide exciting opportunities for children to engage with different cultural traditions through music, movement and performance. Pupils will also take part in an art activity reflecting on cultural diversity and will have the opportunity to enter their work into a Diversity Day Art Competition.

At the end of the day, all children will come together for a colourful Diversity Day parade, celebrating the many cultures, languages and identities represented across our school.

The Importance of Home Languages

At our school, we value and celebrate the many languages spoken by our families. Research shows that maintaining and developing a child's home language brings lifelong benefits. Strong home language skills support cognitive development, strengthen literacy and learning in English and help children develop confidence in their identity and sense of belonging. In an increasingly interconnected world, multilingualism is also a valuable life skill, enhancing communication, problem-solving and future educational and career opportunities.

Last year's Diversity Day was a great success and children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their cultures, learning about others and taking part in the various activities. We are looking forward to another wonderful celebration of the rich diversity that makes our school community so special. 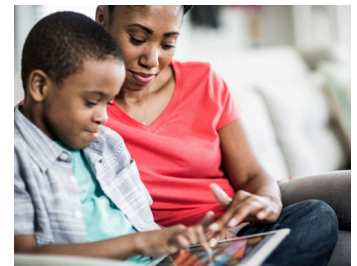
What is Grooming? Helping Parents Understand the Signs



Online Grooming

Online grooming is when an adult tries to build an online relationship with a child so that they can sexually exploit them. They may do this by:

- ⚠️ befriending the child through social media
- ⚠️ chatting in an online forum
- ⚠️ chatting in an online game
- ⚠️ connecting on any other online platform



Grooming is when someone builds a relationship with a child in order to manipulate or exploit them. This can happen both online and in real life, and it often develops gradually.

Online grooming may begin with friendly conversations. The person may offer compliments, gifts in games, or attention, which can make the child feel special. Over time, they may try to move conversations to private platforms or ask the child to keep secrets.

Changes in behaviour can sometimes be a sign. A child may become more secretive about their online activity, spend more time on devices, or become upset when unable to access them.

It is important to remember that grooming is never the child's fault. Children may not recognise that something is wrong, particularly if they feel they have built a friendship.

As a parent, keeping communication open is key. Talk regularly about online experiences and remind your child they can always come to you.

You can also reinforce simple safety rules, such as not sharing personal information and not keeping secrets from trusted adults.

If you are concerned, seek advice and support. Early awareness can help keep children safe.
