Celebrating Diversity Day – Friday 19th June

We are excited to announce that on Friday 19th June we will be holding a whole-school Diversity Day as part of our English as an Additional Language (EAL) provision. This special day will celebrate the many languages, cultures, traditions and experiences that make our school community so rich and vibrant.

Children are invited to come to school dressed in their national colours, traditional or folk costumes or the colours of their favourite football team. Throughout the day, there will be many opportunities to learn about and celebrate the diverse backgrounds represented within our school.

Those who wish to do so will be able to give a short presentation to their class about a country that is important to them and their family. Children are welcome to bring photographs, albums, artefacts or other items that help them to share their culture and heritage with their classmates.

The day will also include special assemblies celebrating the diversity of our school community. We are delighted that children from our Polish and Spanish after-school clubs will be sharing performances, showcasing their language skills and cultural traditions.

In addition, pupils will take part in a range of creative workshops. Depending on their year group, children will either learn a World Cup-themed dance inspired by one of the participating nations or experience an African drumming workshop. These activities will provide exciting opportunities for children to engage with different cultural traditions through music, movement and performance. Pupils will also take part in an art activity reflecting on cultural diversity and will have the opportunity to enter their work into a Diversity Day Art Competition.

At the end of the day, all children will come together for a colourful Diversity Day parade, celebrating the many cultures, languages and identities represented across our school.

The Importance of Home Languages

At our school, we value and celebrate the many languages spoken by our families. Research shows that maintaining and developing a child's home language brings lifelong benefits. Strong home language skills support cognitive development, strengthen literacy and learning in English and help children develop confidence in their identity and sense of belonging. In an increasingly interconnected world, multilingualism is also a valuable life skill, enhancing communication, problem-solving and future educational and career opportunities.

Last year's Diversity Day was a great success and children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their cultures, learning about others and taking part in the various activities. We are looking forward to another wonderful celebration of the rich diversity that makes our school community so special. 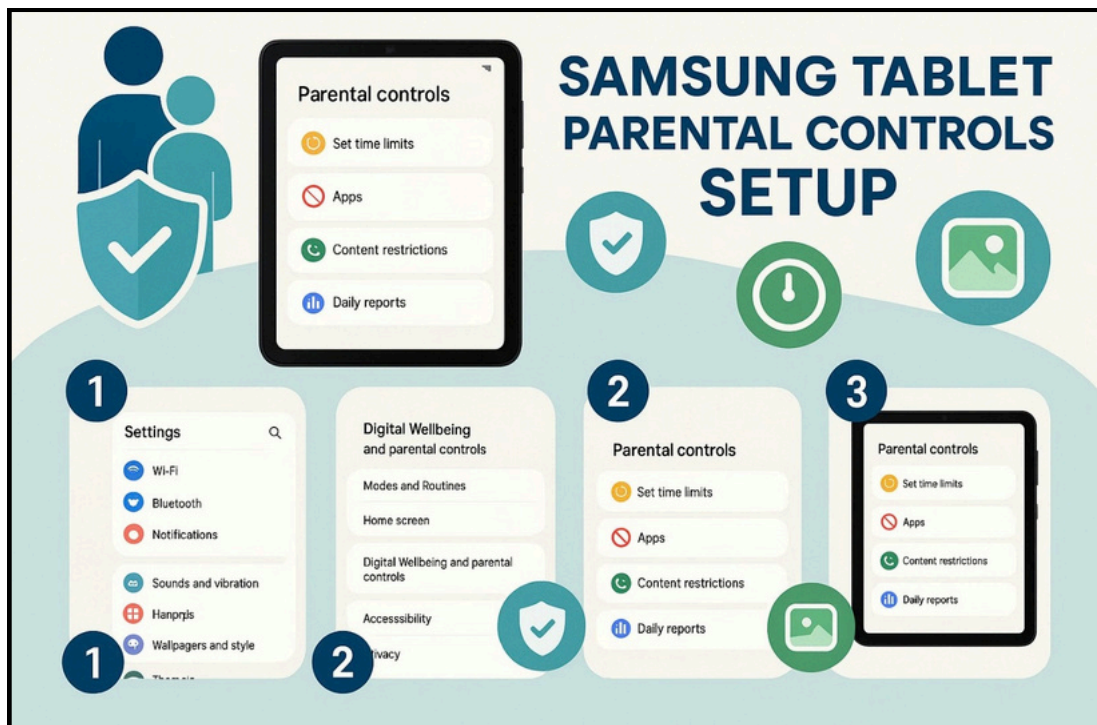

Online Safety:

Parental Controls – A Helpful Tool



Parental controls are a useful way to support children in using technology safely. They can help manage what children access, how long they spend online, and who they can communicate with.

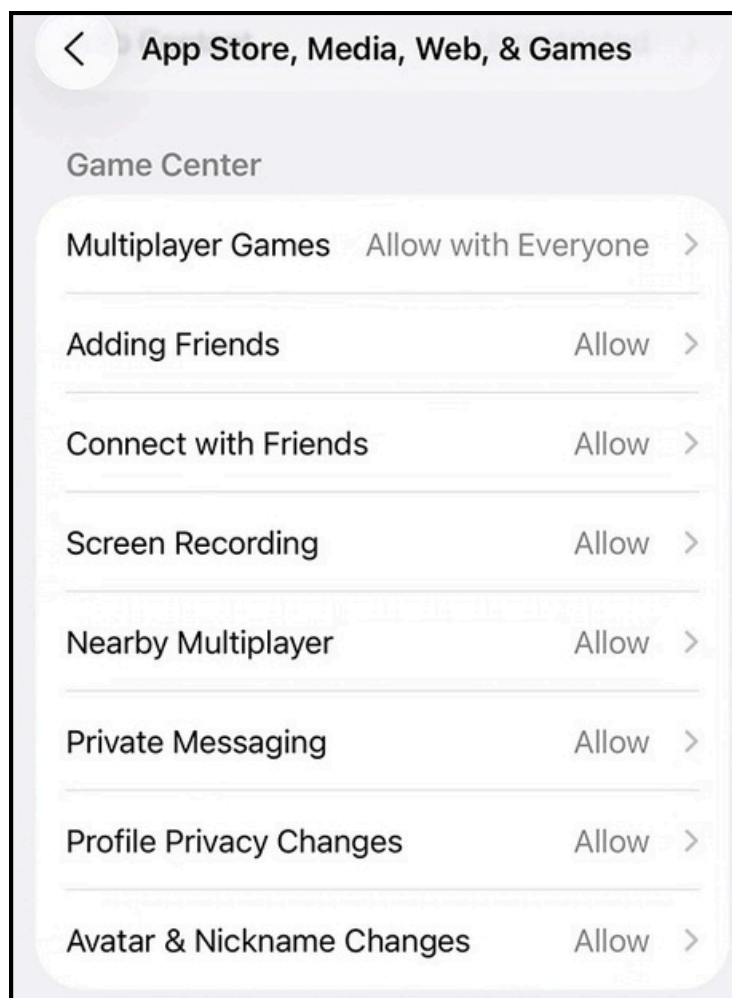
Many devices now include built-in parental controls. These allow you to set screen time limits, restrict certain apps, and filter inappropriate content. There are also controls available on gaming consoles and streaming platforms.

While these tools are helpful, they work best alongside open communication. Technology alone cannot replace conversations about online safety.

It is a good idea to explore settings together with your child. This helps them understand why boundaries are in place and encourages responsible use.

You might also agree on rules as a family, such as where devices can be used and how long for. Involving children in these decisions can help them feel more responsible and willing to follow expectations.

Parental controls are not about removing independence, but about guiding children as they learn to navigate the online world safely.

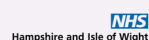
About the Workshop
